At age 11, Angie successfully passed the OMTA Syllabus Level 10 Exam with Honors. Her first solo piano recital will be held Sunday, April 6th, 2014.

Angie completed her 5 years of elementary school at ACCESS Academy, an accelerated program for highly gifted students. She is currently a 7th grader at Summa Stoller, a talented and gifted program in Beaverton. Angie excels in mathematics and science. She completed Algebra in 5th grade, Geometry and Advanced Algebra in 6th and 7th grades. Angie also received third place from the Intel Northwest Science Expo Science Fair in 2013.

Additionally, Angie has been a proud swimmer on the Dolphins Swim Team since age 7. She was an Oregon Top-5 swimmer at age 8, and one of the four members setting an Oregon State record in the 200-yard Free Relay for girls 9-10 in 2012. In the 2014 OSI 11-14 Championships, Angie won a total of nine medals, four in team relays and five in individual events.
